Rules:

1. Respect yourself, teacher and other students.
2. Respect the teacher's right to teach and the other student's right to learn. This means you are quiet when the teacher is talking and you raise your hand in order to speak in class.
3. Respect a person's property and space.
4. Please be in the room and prepared for class BEFORE the bell rings. Tardies will be kept.
5. Please do not eat or drink in the classroom. Water bottles will be allowed.
6. Please keep your head up at all times.
7. Keep electronic devices out of sight (and turned off)!! This includes ipods, cd players/headphones, cell phones, etc.
8. Students will remain in their seats until the bell rings. Lining up at the door will not be allowed.
9. Cheating will not be tolerated. Any student(s) caught cheating will receive a zero for that particular assignment.
10. All school rules will be enforced.

Grading:

1. Grades are determined by a percent of total points possible. Total points will be comprised of test scores, quizzes, homework and class projects.

2. Make up work: Check with the teacher/classmates when absent for missed assignments, bellringer questions for journal, etc. It is your responsibility!!
 - **Late assignments-** Assignments are due when the teacher collects them. Anything turned in after that time is considered late. ½ credit will be given for late assignments, but are due by the unit test or end of the unit. Make sure your name and period are on the assignment and turn it into the "Late Work" bin.
 - **Excused absences-** 1 day for everyday ill to make up missed work. It is your responsibility to check the Monday-Friday bins to get any handouts or assignments you missed while you were absent. Make sure to turn in assignments that were collected while you were absent. See teacher if you have questions.
 - **Truancies-** 0 points for any test or assignments missed on that day
3. **Make sure your first and last name appear on all assignments. Assignments with no name on them will not be graded and the student will receive a zero for that assignment.** Check the No name, no credit manilla folder for assignments that did not have a name on them.

Extra Credit: 50 points possible: See me for specifics/expectations before attempting E.C.

(All extra credit must be turned in at least one week before final exam & all regular assignments must be turned in before extra credit can be attempted. —no exceptions!)

1. Health Article Summaries/Reflections (5 points possible per article)
1 page typed (a paragraph summary & a paragraph reflection—what you thought about the article, how can you relate, etc. Must turn in the article with typed paper)
2. Reports on Health Topics---must include a bibliography (10 points possible)
2 pages typed
3. Health Posters (10 points possible)---maximum of 2 can be done
4. Record a TV program concerning a Health Topic (Dateline, Oprah, etc.)
Bring in a VHS copy of the show and a 1 page typed summary/reflection (10 pts. Possible)
5. Healthy brochures—make a brochure on a health topic of your choice—bibliography needs to be included (10 points possible)

Extra credit opportunities will also be offered throughout the course of the semester.
